Trinity UMC is working with the San Antonio Food Bank to create a network of home gardens to supply fresh fruits and vegetables to the poor and hungry in South Texas. Trinity will be an ongoing collection point, a "Crop Drop", where people can donate their produce. As a part of that effort, Trinity is hosting three free lessons on organic gardening here at the church on **March 12, 19, and 26, starting at 9AM.** The classes will be taught by Mr. Pedro Schambon, a gifted speaker who runs a 20-acre organic farm in Seguin. Anyone interested in starting their own garden or helping out in the Victory Garden may benefit from this. We could also really use the support of some friendly people to help welcome our guests on those mornings.



We will be working on the Victory Garden every Saturday morning, so come out and give us a hand.

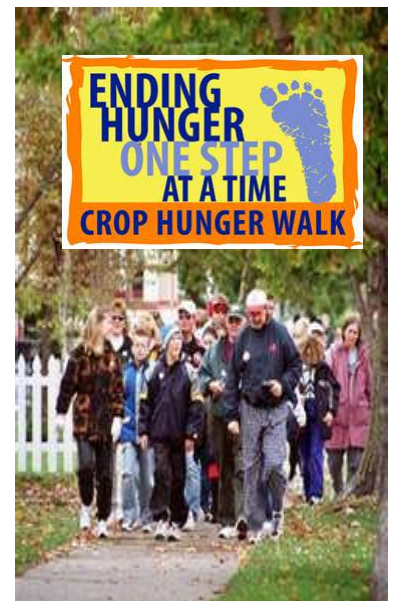

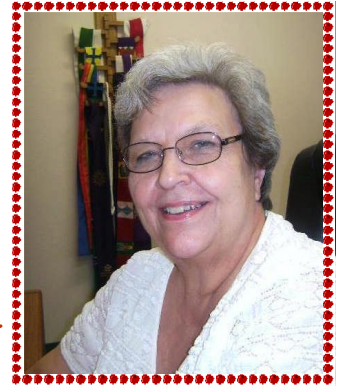
John Reed is signing up walkers for the Crop Walk, to be held **March 5 and March 6** this year. Please see him in the Narthex after services.

We are about to enter the **Lenten Season**. This is a time of self-reflection, prayer, and study. The Hales are leading a study, **Radical Renovation**, in their home. If you would like information about that study, please, **call Mary at 523-7206**. I will be leading a study, **The Passion and Death of Jesus, on Sunday evenings at 6:00**. Two people have signed up for that study on **Tuesday night**. For that group to make, we need 4 more people to sign up. If you are interested in either the Sunday evening group or the Tuesday evening group, please, call the church office.

On Tuesday, March 8th, we will celebrate Fat Tuesday with a pancake and sausage supper from 5:30 til 7:00 p.m. As many of you know, it is free and the pancakes are delicious.

There are always more things to do at the church, and more things to do outside of the church during these times. But in both of these seasons, we need to carve out a time for meditation and self-reflection. It is very easy to get caught up in all the "doing" that we find ourselves exhausted. It is also possible to find ourselves feeling spiritually empty and at a distance from God at the very time that we should find ourselves growing closer to God.

At Advent/Christmas we look forward eagerly to the celebration of the birth of our Savior. During Lent/Easter we walk the road to Calvary and then we celebrate the greatest gift of all—the Resurrection. It is not only the resurrection of Christ that we celebrate, but also the assurance we have of resurrection.

I pray that each of you take some extra time over the next few weeks to prayerfully reflect on the last months and the last weeks of Jesus' earthly life and consider what a sacrifice he made for us. Then CELEBRATE the Resurrection. I look forward to sharing this time with all of you.

What is your hope and vision for the future?

Not really sure what I would say, I said yes to David on the phone when he asked to speak about my hope and vision for the future of Trinity.

I spoke to all my respective peers on the subject. I considered what had already been said on the previous topics and thought about what I would the future to look like.

Lou Armstrong spoke about seeing further than our eyes could see. Being somewhat of a Star Trek fan, to quote Gene Roddenberry, the series creator "To boldly go where no one has gone before", I thought yeah that is our mission to be bold in our lives, at church, at work, with our friends, to share the message that was given to us by our King.

My hope is that Trinity never loses the practice of love. When Jesus returned to his disciples he said when I am gone love each other. When we get so wrapped up in loving ourselves, our family and friends that we lose sight of who first loved us and that we are supposed to reflect that love to the world the way Jesus did. It's true, it is harder for us to be Christ like and practice the kind of love Jesus displayed because he was so nomadic. He would come into town most times surrounded by hundreds if not thousands of people speaking about the miracles he performed. Heck in some cases it would happen right before their eyes. He would preach to them in parables confuse and shock them and leave. You have to admit it's a lot harder to ever get mad at someone when they leave a couple of days later after you heard incredible things about them and from them.

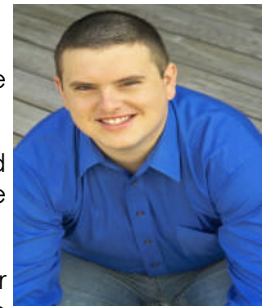
Maybe that's why some of us lose the hope of love. When you're a child there is love everywhere. Jesus spoke of children and the innocence they possess. My daughter Emma freely gives out hugs to anyone who would have them. But as we get older we become cynical and hardened by our experiences. We experience love that is not returned and we find out how much that hurts. I know there are people in this room that feel small, if not tremendous amounts of pain on a regular basis. The hope of love is what we all really want. We know there are people who will always love us, our parents, our grandparents, and friends. But what about the people we encounter at work? What about the new people I meet at my church? What about the people I meet at the Habitat project this weekend? What about the other kids at my school? Will they think I'm a mean boss? Will they like me? Will they think I dress funny? Will they think I'm a dork?

I know what would make me feel better about myself. I will just make fun of other people before they can hurt me with their judgment. I will not make friends at work. I will keep it strictly business, and not get involved with anybody on a personal level. It's not their business anyway I only have to look for me and no one else needs to help me. Church should be a hospital where we triage patients and send them back into the world healed and full of the hope of love. When we spend time at church we should surround everyone with love and fill them with the hope of love. This is my hope for your church, this is the hope for my church, and this is the hope for our church.

One of the definitions for vision given by dictionary.com is a vivid, imaginative conception or anticipation. Imaginative conception, what a great combination? It makes think about the missions of our church. What if I read an article twenty years from now, what would that article say about us and about this church? I think it would read like this:

Today Trinity United Methodist Church dedicated a brand new wing to the computer lab that was built almost ten years ago. The orphanage in Muziti has changed dramatically in the last 15 years. The whole story started with a well because of the basic need for water. Since then the village has been assisted in the installation of electricity, the building of a larger parsonage, the design and setting up of a computer lab to bring the internet to the next generation of Muziti. Concert fundraisers held at Trinity were a large contributor to raising donations and drawing in large numbers of volunteers and new church members. Trinity which started as what could have been categorized as a small church has seen tremendous growth in recent years with over 600 worshipers attending traditional and contemporary services, 200 youth and small children attending Sunday school. Habitat for Humanity has seen countless homes built by volunteers; their Crop Walk program has raised over 1 million dollars alone in the last 12 years of participation. Crop Walk benefits the Church World Services and is responsible for the relief efforts in numerous countries and natural disasters. With the implementation of an account that provides support to missions and provides grants to local students who attend Trinity, the Permanent Endowment Fund has provided scholarships for over 300 college students. Trinity continues to show that with enough will and determination no task is too large or too difficult to accomplish if you work as a team and put the needs of their community first. This church has achieved huge victories in a small amount of time with limited resources and a truckload of love and hope.

This is a place of real help and real love.

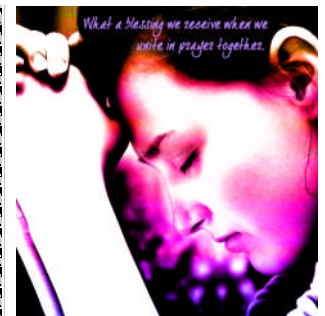

MUZITI UMC, ZIMBABWE WATER WELL TO BE DEDICATED 5TH JUNE 2011

On Sunday June 5th, 2011 the Zimbabwe UMVIM team and the villagers of Muziti in Africa will dedicate the water well distribution system at Muziti UMC, Zimbabwe Africa.

Rev Tedious Mwadiwa work with Muziti UMC Advisory Committee have now selected the vendor to construct the borehole at Muziti. The project has 3 stages, the borehole drilling, the construction of the water reservoir and the distribution of the water. Donations to complete the water well project can be sent to Trinity UMC marked "Zimbabwe Mission—Water Well"

The San Antonio UMVIM to Zimbabwe, the United Methodist Churches in South West Texas (SWTX) Conference raised funds to construct the water well when the late Bishop Muzorewa came to San Antonio Nov 2009. Churches in SWTX have "partnered with Muziti UMC church in Zimbabwe Africa to construct a well water distribution system. The water well system will include a water well with electricity, a water reservoir and water distribution system.

Muziti UMC centre consists of the church, the school attended by 600 children in high school and primary school, and teachers' houses.

The children come to attend school at Muziti from as far away as 8 miles. They walk to school every day. Pastor Tedious

Mwadiwa has formed a Muziti Water Project Advisor Committee to oversee the construction of the well water distribution project. The committee members are Mr Makoni (Construction background), Mr Mazire (Windmill water production manager), Mr. Muziti, Mr Mugadza, Mrs Marawa (Head Primary School), Mrs Mbizho (Head of High School) Mrs Nyamabveni (Technical), Mr Kanhungune (Technical).

The water well project will help to stabilize the day to day life of the children at the school because their teachers will be able to live at the school instead of commuting daily 12 miles to the



nearest place that has running water and energy.

JUNE 2011 ZIMBABWE MISSION

The Zimbabwe UMVIM team from San Antonio, TX will travel to Muziti, Zimbabwe, Africa with a mission to "create global partnerships for development", is construction of the water well distribution system, biblical studies, English language and Modern Communication and give out readers. which is one of the millennium development goals worldwide for the United Methodist

church.

UMVIM in SA district and Muziti UMC in Zimbabwe Africa are partners to help construct the well water distribution system, distribute text books to the underprivileged children at the school, provide the people with readers, learn to read and write English, and conduct Modern Communications workshop.

The Zimbabwe-UMVIM team from San Antonio will include 4 churches Trinity UMC, University UMC, Laurel Heights UMC, and a church in Alabama. The team will be represented by 8 people.

The UMVIM group from San Antonio will visit

Muziti UMC— where they will dedicate the water well distribution system. **Chitakatira and Zimunya Skills Center** in the Mutare area. **Africa University** where there will be a graduation ceremony. **Old Mutare UMC centre** where there will be a church service and celebrating The Life of Bishop A T Muzorewa and Mrs. M. Muzorewa's Life.
